## Lawrence Hill

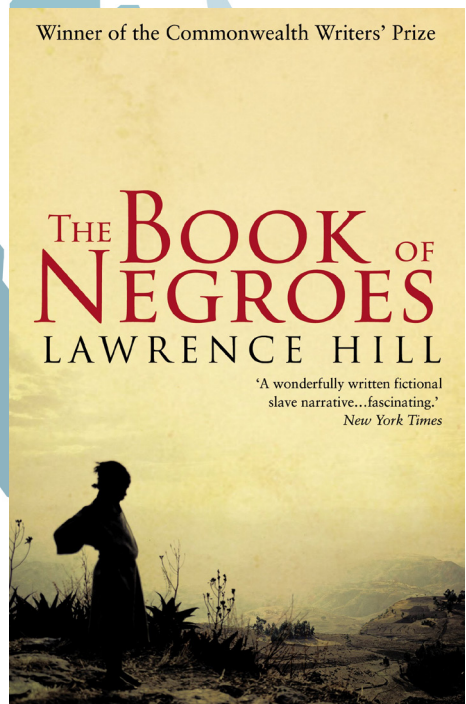
Hill is the author of ten books of fiction and non-fiction. In 2005, he won his first literary honour: a National Magazine Award for the article "Is Africa's Pain Black America's Burden?" published in *The Walrus*.

His first two novels were *Some Great Thing* and *Any Known Blood*, and his first non-fiction work to attract national attention was the memoir *Black Berry, Sweet Juice: On Being Black and White in Canada*.

But it was his third novel, *The Book of Negroes* (HarperCollins Canada, 2007) – published in some countries as *Someone Knows My Name* and in French as *Aminata* – that attracted widespread attention in Canada and other countries.
