Call to Order

Quorum being met, the meeting was called to order at 18:36 by Damir.

I. Introductions and review of minutes from the previous meeting

In today's meeting we had the privilege of two guests – Neal Adolph from the United Way and Curtis from the Vancouver Island Young Worker's Committee.

II. Old Business

- a) Community Outreach Event Rescheduling
 - Neal and Sky have liaised over the past several months about potential events that the Committee would participate in.
 - It was noted that weekends are preferred, and that two possibilities in general are library tents at festivals and events, where one would read a story to children then distribute books free of charge, and also after-school programs.
 - Something that is coming up soon is the BC Federation of Labour's annual Christmas dinner, which takes place in two locations – in Vancouver and in Surrey. The events are well attended and take place on Christmas Eve afternoon/evening. Besides helpers for the dinners themselves, volunteers are also sought for the several preceding days to help with sorting donations and putting together hampers to be distributed.
 - Neal also discussed their Tampon Tuesday project, which has since been renamed Period Promise – this project started as one where they would raise donations of hygiene products for distribution to places that distribute them to those in need (e.g. YWCA), and that they have expanded beyond collection and distribution of products to go into advocacy on access. This project requires volunteers to assist with the collection of products from collection points, sorting and counting them, and then distributing them to community

organizations. Neal advised that the demand is very significant, that last year they delivered 12000 units to the YWCA alone, but that's the amount of product that they go through in just one month.

 Neal / United Way will be doing cross union engagement projects in the future – ETA is late 2019 / early 2020.

- b) Posters & promotional materials for the MHGYWC

- d) All committee members are encouraged, if their local does not have a Young Worker Rep position with their local, to request at their next AGM to have the position created
- e) Connect with the VIYWC (Vancouver Island Young Worker's Committee) to establish a network of Young Worker Reps
 - Sky advised that her component (Agriculture) has Young Worker committees in Eastern Canada, but not in Western Canada
- f) Follow up on Deanna's networking efforts to connect with union components under PSAC to reach out to individual Young Worker reps and component level Young Worker Committees

IV. New Business

a) Soaring to Success Initiative

As indicated in the prior meeting, \$1305 was raised. As the school is able to purchase supplies at a discounted rate themselves, since the last meeting, we have already forwarded the raised funds to them and wish them all the best.

b) Annual Donation

There was discussion with Neal Adolph of the United Way on how work can be done not just through fundraising and distribution of funds and/or goods, but also on collaboration, research, policy promotion and joint efforts to achieve social goals.

Some programs include the previously mentioned Period Promise campaign, but also student/youth mentors & after school programs, and working to minimize senior isolation.

It was noted when donating to the United Way that one can request the funds be directed to specific initiatives.

The Committee has previously moved to donate \$200 to each of the United Way of the Lower Mainland and United Way of Northern British Columbia, but the funds have not actually been made out yet.

Motion to confirm the previously agreed upon donations, with a note for them to be designated to youth initiatives Moved by Damir Seconded by Jessica Motion carried unanimously
