• Dec 6 CANDLE LIGHT VIGIL - pamphlets for the event are at the printer, Posters have been sent out and please post on your bulletin boards, it is open to everyone. We are lucky that Virginia Vaillancourt will be here to mark the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Dec 6 tragedy. She was a founding member/ chair of the Victoria Women's Committee and had the permanent monument established at Holland Point. It is a reminder that women are living with violence everyday. Volunteers are need to help set up on the day of the event. The candles are purple as a symbol of remembrance. There are also pins to hand out with the pamphlets. We would like the volunteers to meet at 4 pm the day of the event to help set up the podium, speaker, table etc. James will pick up the roses. The permit is done and so is the insurance. We will be getting hot chocolate and coffee for the event. Nancy is bringing purple chem lights . there will be 2 sandwich boards at the location. We need one volunteer to stay with the cash donation container. We will be asking people to place a rose on the monument when the person's name is called. Advised to bring flashlights as it is quite dark there. We will bring a tent in case of rain. North Island will advertise on facebook for South Islander who can attend. Also asking for new and nearly new clothes/ coats/new toiletries for kids and women for donations. There are 2 drop off points, one at CFB Esquimalt and on Government Street. Ask Nancy for contacts. We have collected a total of \$1100.00 so far to donate.

Nancy made a motion to rescind the previous meeting's decision where a donation of \$1000.00 was made, she would like the donation to be \$500.00 to the Victoria transition house because of the existing budget for the upcoming year. Nancy moved, Kay seconded recommendation passed.

• Our **guest speaker** arrived.Guest Speaker Susan Howard Fundraiser for Victoria Women's Transition House. <u>https://www.transitionhouse.net/</u> They support women, children and seniors. It takes 7 to 10 attempts to leave their partners. Call it Femicide <u>https://www.femicideincanada.ca/welcome</u> November 25 starts International Day to end violence against women. Runs till December 6, Human Rights Day. 16 day window. Guest speaker talked about how they will be getting land for secondary housing in Langford. Government funding. Susan Howard said they always need baked goods (cookies) they can put in freezer and pull out. They are currently in need of socks, underwear and pajamas. She mentioned Soup Sisters Victoria , where you can get together in groups of up to 25 at Camosun Interurban campus to make soups that are then taken to the house The volunteers get a glass of wine and bowl of soup and bread for their volunteerism. <u>https://www.soupsisters.org/victoria.php</u>
